Document Public Comments:

Staff Comments: The amount of work and new learning to provide distance learning to students at home is significant. The district should consider how to improve tracking attendance for distance learners. Some staff are concerned that attendance notifications are being sent to distant learning families of the few students who are not meeting attendance expectations

Parent Comments: Some parents have expressed keeping students home temporarily (in a distance learning model) due to the recent K-12 mask requirement even within elementary classrooms due to recent DHHS order. One parent indicating an issue hearing and seeing the instruction well during distance learning. One parent commented that he was impressed with LAS's readiness for distant learning compared to the previous school his daughter attended. Another parent expressed greatly appreciating the option to join a class remotely while their student was sick. She indicated that this helps encourage students with illness symptoms to remain at home and not worry about getting behind in their classes.

Reconfirm how instruction (Return to Learn Plan) is going to be delivered during the 20/21 school year:

We are not making any changes to the previously adopted 2020-21 Extended Learning Plan at this time. The continued instructional methods are: Face to face instruction for K-12 with distance learning (via Google Classroom and Google Meet) or virtual learning (via Odysseyware in 3rd - 5th or Edgenuity in 6th - 12th) options for students who opt to stay in their home environment. The district has implemented a stipend for teachers who are instructing distant learners. The district has also implemented a new attendance designation of D' for 'present distance learning' to assist with more consistent tracking of student engagement. Supplemental grant funds have been used to purchase additional webcams and microphones for teachers to assist with audio and visual clarity for distance learners.

Reconfirm whether or not the district is offering higher levels of in-person instruction for English language learners, special education students, or other special populations:

All student populations have the same 3 options at this time (in person, distance or virtual). All Special Education students have had a Contingency Learning Plan (CLP) completed that specifies how their needs will be met if they are attending remotely.
