Review Weekly 2-Way Interaction (Attendance) Rates for Elementary (K-5)

Dates	All Students (232 students)	100% Remote* (4 students)	Not 100% Remote (228 students)

Review Weekly 2-Way Interaction (Attendance) Rates for Jr-Sr High School (6-12)

Document Public Comments:

Staff Comments: One staff member inquired about the data points used to determine if we have 9-12 go remote or put sports on hold. They understood we are taking input from the local health department on this.

Parent Comments: Some parents have expressed a concern about the health aspects of having students required to wear masks all day. A parent of a virtual learner expressed that virtual learners should have the same exam exemption policy as in person students (which is the current plan).

Reconfirm how instruction (Return to Learn Plan) is going to be delivered during the 20/21 school year:

We will continue to follow the adopted 2020-21 Extended Learning Plan and offer K-12 Face To Face instruction with an option for remote instruction as needed. We will continue to monitor local cases, positivity rate and numbers of students/employees who are positive or probable to determine if we need to follow the Governor's recommendation to consider 9-12 being remote and a pause to athletics.

Reconfirm whether or not the district is offering higher levels of in-person instruction for English language learners, special education students, or other special populations:

All K-12 student populations have the same options at this time (in person, distance or virtual). All Special Education students have had a Contingency Learning Plan (CLP) completed that specifies how their needs will be met if they are attending remotely.
