## **Document Public Comments:**

Staff Comments: During remote instruction which started on 11/11, there were some technology issues the first few days but this improved as issues were addressed by tech support. Teachers expressed concern regarding absences and disengagement during remote learning. Chronically absent elementary students have increased considerably.

Parent Comments: One parent expressed frustration with his elementary students being forced to remote learning due to a quarantine for close contact with a probable at school. The parent expressed that the damage due to parents missing work and students not learning is significant and he doesn't believe the school should follow the Health Department recommended quarantines especially after time has passed and no symptoms are present. Parents were disappointed with the extension of the remote learning for the 9th - 12th graders - some have said the older students are going to have a difficult time coming back when this is over.

## **Reconfirm how instruction (Return to Learn Plan) is going to be delivered during the 20/21 school year:**

We are following the previously adopted 2020-21 Extended Learning Plan and plan to transition back to a K-12 Face To Face instruction option after the New Year.

We returned K-8 to a Face to Face option on 11-30-20 with remote instruction continuing for 9th-12th grades (via Google Classroom and Google Meet).

## **Reconfirm whether or not the district is offering higher levels of in-person instruction for English language learners, special education students, or other special populations:**

Beginning 12-9-20 students in need in grades 9-12 were offered a 'higher level of in person support' as they were allowed to access the building to access special education services, mental health service, 504 accommodations or reliable internet. All K-8 student populations have the same options at this time (in person, distance or virtual). All Special Education students have had a Contingency Learning Plan (CLP) completed that specifies how their needs will be met if they are attending remotely.
