Review Weekly 2-Way Interaction (Attendance) Rates for Elementary (K-5)

Staff Comments: Many teachers prefer to not have the distance learning option for the 21-22 year.

Parent Comments: Parents have expressed hoping not to have students required to wear masks in the 21-22 school year.

Reconfirm how instruction (Return to Learn Plan) is going to be delivered during the 20/21 school year:

We will continue to follow the adopted 2020-21 Extended Learning Plan and offer K-12 Face To Face instruction during summer school with an option for virtual instruction if a student chooses to learn at home. At this point, we plan to offer face to face or virtual on a per semester basis next fall. Teachers will remain responsible for providing make-up work to absent students in a manner they find most appropriate. We will take input from CDC guidelines, MDHHS, local Health Dept and MiOSHA in developing guidelines regarding masking and other safeguards.

Reconfirm whether or not the district is offering higher levels of in-person instruction for English language learners, special education students, or other special populations:

All K-12 student populations have the same options at this time (in person or virtual). All Special Education students have had a Contingency Learning Plan (CLP) completed that specifies how their needs will be met if they are attending remotely.
