**Document Public Comments:**

Staff Comments: Many 6-12 teachers appreciate the change to limit distance learners to those that are prearranged. Several have expressed not wanting a distance learning option next year. It takes away from the ability to provide full attention to the in person students and uses up class time. Some lower elementary teachers have expressed wanting to have WIN time back.

Parent Comments: Some parents have expressed a desire to be able to drop students off prior to 8 am.

**Reconfirm how instruction (Return to Learn Plan) is going to be delivered during the 20/21 school year:**

We will continue to follow the adopted 2020-21 Extended Learning Plan and offer K-12 Face To Face instruction with an option for remote instruction as needed. We will allow the 2 classes at the same grade level to be in the same area for WIN time if the teachers request that and can limit close contact between students not in their classroom cohort. We will allow students into the building starting at 7:45 am (even during warmer temperatures) as long as we have enough space to keep grade levels separated and have no more than 6 per table in the cafetorium.

**Reconfirm whether or not the district is offering higher levels of in-person instruction for English language learners, special education students, or other special populations:**

All K-12 student populations have the same options at this time (in person, distance or virtual). All Special Education students have had a Contingency Learning Plan (CLP) completed that specifies how their needs will be met if they are attending remotely.
