Document Public Comments:

Staff Comments: During remote instruction which just started on 11/11, there were some technology issues the first day. Consideration for breaking K and 1 into smaller groups for Google Meets. One high school teacher reported preferring all students in one online format rather than some in person and some on Google Meet.

Parent Comments: I really hope Covid numbers improve so we don't have to be in remote instruction for very long. Having multiple elementary students in different classes simultaneously can be challenging for parents to manage.

Reconfirm how instruction (Return to Learn Plan) is going to be delivered during the 20/21 school year:

We are following the previously adopted 2020-21 Extended Learning Plan but needed to transition to remote learning (similar to Phase 3 plan) even though we are in Phase 4 because of support staff limitations due to quarantines. The district is planning for additional tech support personnel during this transition to remote.

We hope to return to a Face to face instruction option for K-12 on 11-30-20 but if staffing or health concerns prevent this, the district will explore a model of remote instruction for 9th-12th grades and remote for K-8 with distance learning (via Google Classroom and Google Meet) or virtual learning (via Odysseyware in 3rd - 5th or Edgenuity in 6th - 12th) options also for K-8 students who opt to stay in their home environment.

Reconfirm whether or not the district is offering higher levels of in-person instruction for English language learners, special education students, or other special populations:

All student populations have the same options at this time (in person, distance or virtual). All Special Education students have had a Contingency Learning Plan (CLP) completed that specifies how their needs will be met if they are attending remotely. Special education students are permitted to access the building if needed for services during our temporary period of remote learning.
